City of Galveston Police Officer Civil Service exam scheduled

GALVESTON, Texas (Sept. 26, 2021) – The City of Galveston is seeking a diverse pool of candidates for the upcoming Police Civil Service exam, which will be held on October 19, 2023.

The exam is open to all qualified applicants who possess a high school diploma or GED, and 12 hours from an accredited college or university. Candidates must also be 21 years of age by the swear-in date and must be younger than 45 years old by their date of hire. The civil service exam is also open to lateral candidates from other police departments.

“By offering this exam, we are giving those interested the opportunity to become the next generation of civil servants and the ability to make a positive impact on their community,” said Police Chief Doug Balli.

Galveston police officers are responsible for maintaining public safety, enforcing laws, and protecting the community.

City Manager Brian Maxwell and Chief Balli urge eligible candidates interested in a challenging and rewarding career in law enforcement to apply for this examination.
